- ➤ One of the newspaper clippings that Derleth says had caught his eye was headlined *Christmas at Caldermoor*. Surely this would have been a fine Christmas pastiche. Just as Holmes for the Holidays (and its sequel) gave us multiple holiday tales featuring 'The Master,' perhaps we can look forward to a collection of Pons yuletide tales.
- The Adventure of the Sussex Beekeeper is the last unwritten case mentioned. What foe could be worthy of the combined talents of Pons and Holmes. Was Moran somehow free from prison and did he seek the aid of Baron von Kroll in gaining vengeance upon Holmes? Or perhaps some nightmare from long before man walked upon the earth was loosed from within the Sussex cliffs?
